Engagement Summary 1

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Engagement Overview

The City collected input from residents on what they think of the proposed design for Glenmore Recreation Park through an extensive engagement period between January 6 to February 5. A mix of in-person school sessions, virtual workshops and online engagement tools were utilized to get feedback to learn about the public's priority amenities for the park, any shifts in popular activities since the 2016 design, how the new design fit in to the community, and how current/ new users would envision utilizing the park.

Purpose of Engagement

Kelowna regularly seeks input from citizens and stakeholders on community priorities, land use planning, and initiatives, with the intention of making informed and balanced decisions. By understanding the perspectives, opinions, ideas and concerns of people who may be impacted by decisions, the City is dedicated to implementing an open and transparent process. Specifically, in regard to Glenmore Recreation Park, the Citys goal is to inform citizens and stakeholders about the progress and consult on key priorities to update to the concept plan and finalizing of the schematic design.

Get Involved Kelowna

During the engagement period there was a over 6.7k webpage visits to the Get Involved page, with 996 of those participating in the online survey.

Survey Responses

An online survey hosted on Get Involved included a variety of open ended, multiple choice and ranking questions and two virtual workshops dedicated to community and recreational amenities were promoted to residents through signs on site, direct mail outs and digital tactics including social media posts and Castanet ads.



School Engagement


It was paramount that staff heard from students in the surrounding schools, so a team of consultants and City park planners visited Dr. Knox Middle School, North Glenmore Elementary and Glenmore Elementary where students took part in interactive games to help them envision the future of GRP.



Virtual Open House Engagement




The people of Kelowna participated in two virtual open houses over Zoom to provide input on the design of GRP. The sessions were divided into two themes - Community Amenities and Recreation Facilities. During the Community Amenities session, attendees shared their ideas for park features that would benefit the community, such as shaded areas, playgrounds, and walking trails. The Recreation Facilities session focused on the design of sports facilities, including soccer fields, and lighting.

Location. 960 Glenmore Rd, Kelowna, BC

Quick Summary of Event

- The largest school event with over 50 students in attendance in one group.
- Students from grade 6 gave feedback through drawing modeling and writing.
- The engagement team received over 160 activity/feedback sheets from the event.
- This event was close to Glenmore Recreation Park at only 3km away.

Ziplines

The school children from all three schools immediately expressed their desire for ziplines during the engagement activity. In fact, their response was so passionate and unified that it came as no surprise when ziplines became the unanimous favourite play element for the playground element of Glenmore Recreation Park. Lots of the children drew pictures of elaborate ziplines, and asked that the zipline be as creative and different as possible.

Slides

Children from the three schools discussed their wish for a slide amongst themselves, imagining all the possibilities for play and excitement in their engagement sessions. Everyone was in agreement that the slide would provide an unforgettable experience and quickly made it their close second choice for the park. Many great ideas came from the open house and their was an emphasis on a large slide , with many children asking for a slide over 100 feet tall, racing slides, or covered slides.

Trampolines

The students of the 3 schools chose trampolines as their third most desired feature to be included in the Glenmore Recreation Park. The children were incredibly enthusiastic and positive when it came to the inclusion of trampolines as they were very eager to use the facility in the upcoming summers. Their desire to be able to access the park, jump around and have fun on a trampoline was clear to see in their many responses.

2/ École Dr. Knox Middle School

Location. 121 Drysdale Blvd, Kelowna, BC

Quick Summary of Event

- The second largest school group broken up into two sessions with 20 students in each session.
- Students from grade 7 gave feedback through drawing modeling and writing.
- The engagement team received over 130 activity/feedback sheets from the event.
- This event was the closest to Glenmore Recreation Park at just under 700m away.

Splash Park:

Slides

When the consultant team and City of Kelowna asked for feedback from three schools in the area what they wanted to see in a new spray park; the overwhelming response was to install water slides. During the engagement activity all 3 schools drew pictures , modeled and wrote they that this was their number one priority.



Dump Bucket

The tipping/dump buckets were very popular with all the students. The consultant team brought images to help inspire the children and the image of the large dump bucket was by far one of the favourites. Many of the students were creative with their drawings, showing different kinds of tipping buckets incorporated to many different spray park elements.

This was another favourite from the images the consultant team brought. Many students had been to spray parks with ground sprays and expressed how much fun they were.



Location. 125 Snowsell St N, Kelowna, BC

Quick Summary of Event

- The smallest school event with over 20 students in attendance in one group
- Eight classes of Grade 5 and Grade 6 students participated in a park planning exercise prior to the engagement date. Two representatives from each class then shared the ideas from their classmates with the Project Team as they participated in the event, such that all the children of these grades of North Glenmore Elementary were represented.
- The engagement team received over 20 activity/feedback sheets from the event
- This event was close to Glenmore Recreation Park at 1.6 km away.

Youth Zone:

Themes from all 3 school open houses

Basketball

The youth zone activity was a real success! The children had their preferences scattered all across the board, there was one activity that everyone seemed to be passionate about - basketball. Even though volleyball and skateboarding received strong consideration, the overwhelming favourite was for Glenmore Park to have an area dedicated for basketball. The children drew pictures and modeled hoops of different sizes, places to practice trick shots, and courts for all abilities to share.

Volleyball

While the slight favourite was basketball, the second highest vote was for volleyball. Kids enthusiastically voiced their thoughts on the matter, some of them highlighting how it was not enough to just have volleyball courts as it is often not guaranteed that they would be set up for their use. Therefore, the introduction of a volleyball or even a beach volleyball zone into the proposed park was the ideal solution for these young fans of the sport.

Area to Skateboard

The schools responded to the idea of setting up a skateboarding area, or even skatepark in the youth zone of the proposed Glenmore Park plan. Many of them expressed their enthusiasm for the concept, especially the idea of having separate sections for skateboards, scooters, and bikes. Some of the kids even drew and modeled exactly what kinds of features they would want to see. Overall, this activity proved to be the third most popular choices at the events.

Quick Summary of Event

- Key Questions from Event: Which features are you most excited about? Is there anything you would add to the masterplan? Favorite parks in Kelowna or elsewhere? Describe your vision for Glenmore?
- Favorite parks in Kelowna and area: Multiple people enjoy Ben Lee Park for its variety of activities, open space, and shaded seating areas. Quilchena Park and Beasley Park were also popular choices.

Kettle Valley Park, Strathcona Park, and Kinsmen Park were popular for the BBQ pit and courts.

• Peoples preferences for the new features included: more activities for older children including, skate parks and sport courts. Several participants suggested a more flexible running track, and shaded areas around the whole park. There was also lots of discussion surrounding a spray park and sand volleyball courts.


Quick Summary of Event

- Key Questions from Event: What do you want in a sports facility? Good examples? What to avoid? What makes them successful?
- The participants of this session expressed a high priority for lighting in the new park. They believe that lighting would extend the season, especially if all-season cover is not possible.




Survey: Demographics

- Majority of people aged 35-44 took the survey with great participation from people ages 25-34 and 45- 59 years old.
- Majority of females took the survey at 60%.
- The majority of respondents lived near Glenmore Recreation Park. When the respondents were asked why they participated the number one response (60%) was that they live near the park.

While the majority of survey respondents live near Glenmore Recreation Park, there was a great mix of respondents who live all over Kelowna. Most notably was the 109 respondents from the central/downtown area, which made up the second largest area of participation.

Qualitative Survey Results

Parkinson Recreation Centre and the Parkinson surrounding park was mentioned over 95 times and was the clear favourite park for **Recreation Centre** survey respondents. Their favourite feature of the park is the pickleball. 0 0 With over 80 responses and mentions City Park was voted as the survey respondents **City Park** second favourite park. Their favourite feature of the park is the variety of activities. With over 75 responses and mentions Ben Lee Park was voted as the survey **Ben Lee Park** respondents as their third favourite park. Their favourite feature of the park is the splash park. While a close second to the splash park was the skateboard area.


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What do you like best about your favourite park?



Top 3 Proposed Design Features



- Playgrounds were also the number 1 choice for why people went to their current favourite park.
- Tennis ranking higher than pickleball correlates with a slightly higher number of mentions as to why people go to their favourite park.
- The low skatepark ranking correlates with the survey and school age engagement. Reaching out to a skateboard specific usergroup would be a great next step.
- Basketball ranked very highly for the youth zone with the children, this reflects that.

- The desire for new and unique park features aligns with qualitative data where many people claimed that the playgrounds, and sports courts in the Glenmore neighbourhood are outdated.
- As a priority, installation cost was generally ranked lower than the other elements listed

Key Takeaways

- Qualitative data from the survey shows a negative attitude toward including wi-fi and charging in the park. However, in the school engagement sessions, the students were excited to have these features in the park. It was the fifth most popular idea for the youth zone.
- Lighting also ranked fairly high (5th) in the 'is missing in the Glenmore Recreation Park' question, with people asking for lighting all over the park.

1. Wheelchair

269 mentions

Wheelchair access.



2. Mobility

228 mentions

Other mobility issues other than wheelchair access.



3. Cognitive

223 mentions

Cognitive issues such as memory loss to dementia.





113 mentions Hearing impairment.





111 mentions Visual impairment.



22 mentions

Other mentions included dealing with neurodivergent children and other motor skill impairment.

Themes

What theme would you like to see in the Design/Development of Glenmore Park?



1. Agriculture

595 mentions

The agriculture theme was the most prevalent, with over 150 mentions more than the Dry Valley.



2. Dry Valley

428 mentions

The Dry Valley theme, focusing on the relationship between water and drought, was the second most popular choice, with a sizable difference between Hill/Dale in third place.



3. Hill/Dale

196 mentions

The Hill / Dale (or 'Glen' in Scottish terms) theme took third place in the rankings of the most sought-after styles.



4. Other

The "other" theme was the least popular, garnering only 48 mentions.

4. Parking

39 mentions

Asking for additional parking, accessible parking and revised parking layout.



7. Volleyball

27 mentions

Asking for outdoor area to play volleyball or beach volleyball. Many people noted its hard to find a place to play anywhere in Kelowna.



10. Winter use

23 mentions

The majority of winter use was around people asking for an area to skate in the winter, but also included cross country skiing and even outdoor curling.



5. Lighting

Asking for lighting for the soccer field, for the future sport courts and other parts of the park to be well lit.



8. Swimming

26 mentions

Most of these mentions asking for an outdoor swimming pool as well as asking for an indoor swimming facility.



11. Park Access

20 mentions

The main concern with park access for people was the crossing the road from existing neighborhoods.



6. Baseball

30 mentions

Asking for baseball, softball, and even areas to warm up (batting cages).



9. Track and Field

24 mentions

Many mentions of a multi use track, and areas to practice various track and field skills.



12. Recreation Building

19 mentions

Lots of reference to Parkinson Recreation Centre , people would like to see something similar at Glenmore Recreation Park.

Qualitative Survey Results

Main Themes From Final Thoughts:



FinalThoughts

4/. Pickleball

15 mentions of people asking for pickleball courts.

"I can't stress the importance of pickleball facilities as soon as possible, the registration for the KPClub filled in a matter of days, there is a continuing influx of people to Kelowna with one of the major attractions being pickleball."

5/. Pool

11 mentions of people asking for an outdoor or indoor swimming facility.

"North Glenmore is far from the lake, and we need a swimming pool."

6/. Tennis

11 mentions of people asking for tennis courts.

"Tennis courts please!! It's so hard to find places to play especially with so many pickleball courts taking over."

8/. No Cricket

10 mentions of people not wanting a cricket field/ or to share existing fields with cricket.

"I will repeat my earlier comment about that it seems strange to dedicate such a large part of the park to cricket."

7/. Parking

10 mentions of concern for lack of parking.

"Parking needs to be a priority as well. It can be very busy with the soccer, if you add the pickleball and tennis, that will increase the cars."

9/. Washrooms

9 mentions about the need for year round washrooms in a central location.

"City maintained/operated washrooms are key - so many families spend most of their Saturdays in the spring, summer, and fall on fields with no washroom facilities."

Next Steps

City staff and the design consultant will review survey responses and synthesize the data into themes from most commented on to least. With park construction scheduled to begin in the near future.

Respondent feedback in addition to design best practices, amenities elsewhere in the neighbourhood and existing policy guidelines for neighbourhood level parks will inform the final design of the new park.





While a variety of tactics were used to reach a diverse range of citizens (see: Public outreach), results from open surveys such as those provided do not represent a statistically significant, random sample of all Kelowna citizens. Due to the opt-in and open nature of participation, results do not necessarily reflect the views of all Kelowna citizens.

Additional efforts were made to connect with harder-to-reach communities via stakeholder and community liaison networks; however, under-represented groups and individuals remain under-represented in the overall results.


Additionally, results may not be representative of groups experiencing the greatest housing need, including those experiencing homelessness or accessing housing with supports.






